Holiday Learning

Current research in the US suggests the evidence is mixed on whether students suffer learning loss over the summer break. A recent American paper published in the journal, *Sociological Science*, found that different standardised tests can give wildly different answers on this question. The challenge is around assessing the validity of formal and informal learning over summer.

In Australia, I believe there is an opportunity provided by the summer break for parents and carers to engage in informal learning opportunities with their families.

Hildegard Award

Earlier this year, we launched the Hildegard Award for students in Years 7-11. The

award encourages students to receive recognition and funding for an initiative that will create a better world. The successful proposal was judged based on how strongly it reflects who we are, our College values, and vision and mission.

We received very considered and thought-provoking submissions for this year's Hildegard Award, making the final decision a difficult one. It is with great pleasure we announce that the 2023 Hildegard Award winner is Abbie R of Year 8 for her submission titled, "The Stigma of Periods". Abbie proposed a 3-step platform for removing the stigma associated with menstrual cycles through speech, posters and further education in PDHPE classes.



As well as receiving the official Hildegard Award trophy at the Year 8 End of Year Award Presentation, Abbie will also receive a \$100 cash prize plus an additional \$100 that will be donated on her behalf to the Good Samaritan Inn.

Help us share that peace with everyone we encounter,



Women and Children First (Dee Why) Guest Speaker

We welcomed Tanya from Women and Children First, Dee Why Refuge Hub as a guest speaker at the whole school assembly on Tuesday 14 November to acknowledge the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women.

Tanya was able to educate our school community to break down stigma and misconceptions surrounding women and children caught up in cycles of domestic violence and to have a default setting inherently embedded within each student to: "expect respect".

Making a Difference (MAD) and Social Justice are looking to give some practical help in support of Women and Children First in Dee Why by facilitating a roster of students who would be able to help the women "at shelter" by working with their primary school aged children and assisting them with their homework once a week on a Tuesday afternoon. While the children are receiving help with their homework, their mums are able to be freed up to access support services to help them break out of negative circumstances.
